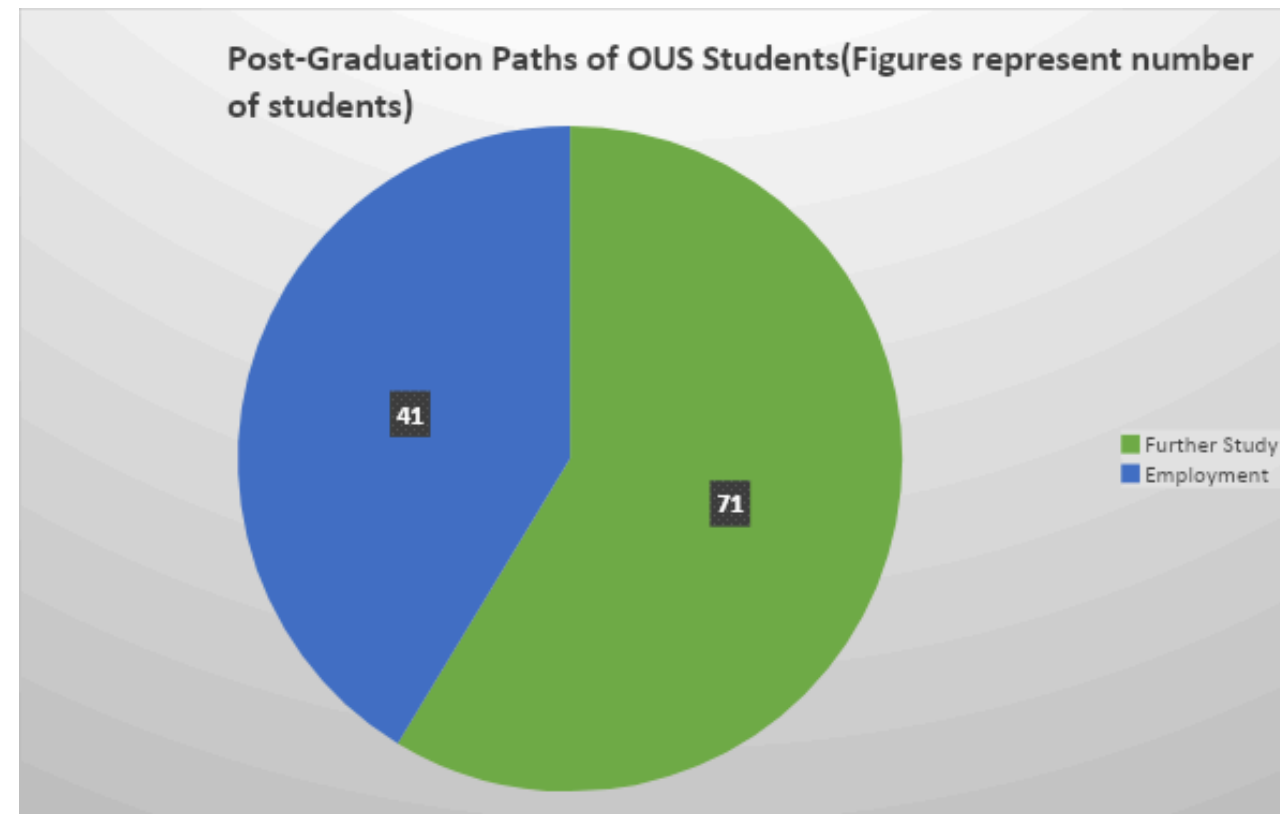

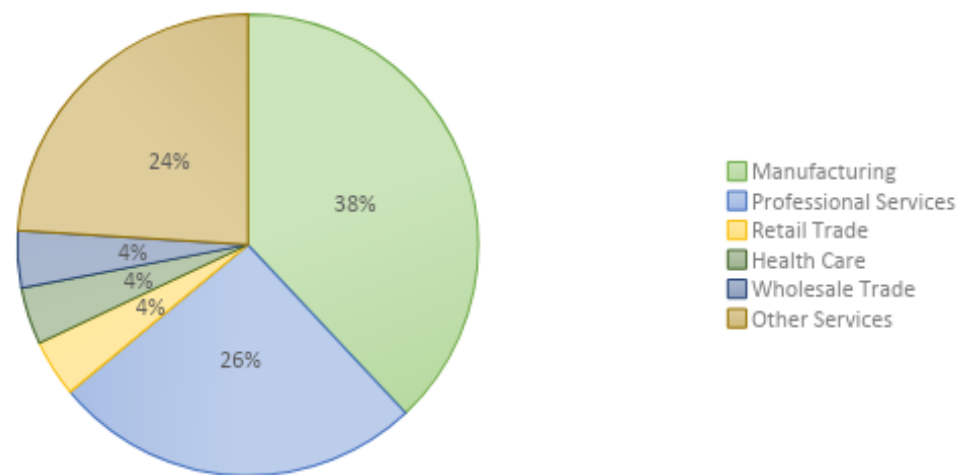

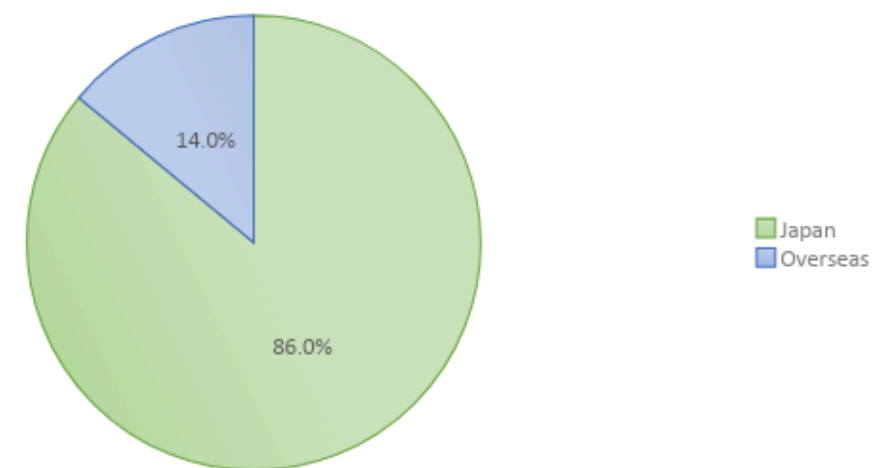

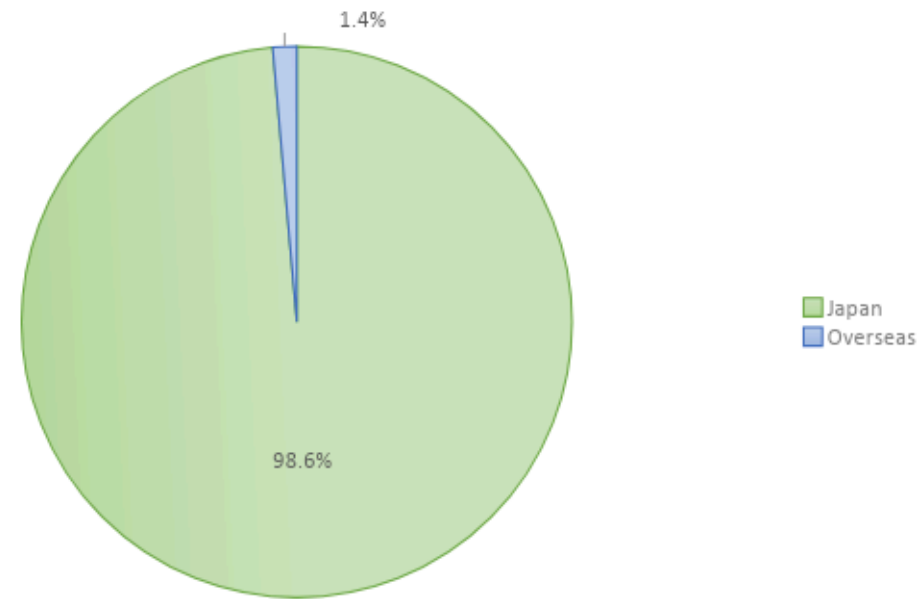

## From Campus to Career: How University Students Can Find Jobs in Japan

Job hunting for university students in Japan typically begins during what is known as the "recruitment season." This period usually starts in the spring of the third year (around March to April). During this time, companies initiate their recruitment briefings for new graduates, and students engage in activities such as researching potential employers, submitting entry sheets, and preparing for interviews. The formal selection process generally begins in the summer before the fourth year and concludes with final interviews in the fall. Applications and participation in internships also take place during this period.

However, this timeline is typical and can vary slightly depending on the industry or specific company. Additionally, for international students, some companies may follow different recruitment schedules, making it essential to verify the recruitment details of each company.

Below, we provide three strategies to help you find job opportunities.

**Utilizing the Career Division:** OUS offers dedicated divisions for career consultations, actively supporting students in their job search efforts. Services available include resume critiques, mock interviews, and career counseling.

**Okayama Campus:** Career Center (グローバルセンター), 4 Fl., C1 Bldg.

**Participating in Job Fairs:** Job fairs in Japan provide an excellent opportunity to meet directly with HR representatives from various industries and companies. **Internships:** Internships are highly regarded in Japan as an integral part of the job-seeking process. Many companies offer programs that not only provide valuable work experience but also allow students to consider these companies as potential future employers. Take advantage of these opportunities to secure your career path.

**HelloWork:** Japan's public employment service agency, offering a broad array of support to job seekers, including international students. Its key services include job referrals, access to employment listings, career counseling, basic guidance on obtaining work visas, and opportunities to participate in employment seminars and workshops.
